CELEBRATING A LEGACY OF FAITH AND IMPACT

Over the past 20 years, our story has been written through countless lives touched and transformed by God's love. Our journey has been a tapestry woven with answered prayers, shared burdens, celebrated victories, laughter, comforting tears, and moments of profound spiritual growth. We have been a beacon of hope in our community and families, offering a place of prayer, belonging, and a message of redemption. We have walked by faith, and not by sight, and have witnessed many lives touched and transformed by God through YahShua the Messiah. As a Church of God 7th Day, our commitment to upholding the Commandments and faith of YahShua has been the bedrock of our ministry.

'Advocacy for "Bible Organization": He strongly advocated for a specific leadership model involving twelve apostles, seventy elders, and seven men chosen by lot, a key point of difference from the Stanberry, Missouri faction of the Church of God (Seventh Day). During the fall of 1931, Andrew N. Dugger was commissioned by the Executive Committees of the Church of God (Seventh Day) in Salem, WV, and Stanberry, MO, to set up a World Headquarters in Jerusalem. His focus was not on North America but on foreign countries. He moved to Israel later and established a headquarters there with a printing press. Because of this, the gospel went throughout the world, including the Caribbean, Scotland, Africa, Europe, India, and other third-world countries.

The first islands known to have churches were Trinidad, Jamaica, and St. Lucia. In the years following, missionaries and evangelists were sent throughout the different parts of the Greater and Lesser Antilles and the Virgin Islands to establish churches. A. N. Dugger wrote over 150 different tracts and books, such as Israel Correspondent Bible School lessons, the very popular Mt. Zion Reporter (also known to some as the Judah Magazine), Sabbath Lesson quarterlies, the Jerusalem Messenger, Jewish calendars, and the Chart of the Daniel image and Beasts of Revelation. He wrote the 40 Points of Doctrine, which form the core of the Church of God 7th Day beliefs. The Mt. Zion Reporter was such an intricate part of these churches that an article was read from this magazine every Sabbath morning during service. The three most famous books and writings are Bible Home Instructor, History of the True Religion, Daniel and Revelation and The 40 Points of Doctrines.

The Jerusalem World Headquarters had representatives laboring in establishing this true faith in about every country of the world, where many congregations have been raised up, and many evangelists continue laboring even though the headquarters is no more. In 1970, Elder A.M. Shoemaker was sent in answer to a call from Kenya, Africa. In about two months of labor there he baptized 284 converts and ordained sixteen men called to the ministry, and received the Baptism of the Holy Spirit. The Jerusalem Messenger, which was published at Jerusalem, gave many reports and photographs of groups and workers around the world who love Jerusalem. Psalm 128:5, 6. There are several other groups of this same faith with some slight non-essential doctrinal differences in various places, carrying on a good work, and printing various publications from their national headquarters. We believe they are all gathering fruit for the kingdom, and the foundation creed of all of these groups is the same, viz., Revelation 12:17, —the commandments of Elohim and the testimonies of Yahshua (Christ). One of these headquarters is Denver, Colorado; another, Meridian, Idaho, and some that make the sacred Hebrew names of the Father and the Son, a special part of their message (Proverbs 30:4; Psalm 68:4, and 91:14, also 69:35, 36, and Isaiah 52:6) are located at Junction City, Oregon, and Jackson Gap, Alabama, also The Faith of Holt, Michigan as well as in Kenya, Jamica, and many other countries. We believe that even though in the interim we don't have headquarters in Jerusalem, these will all fall in line with the Holy Scriptures and publicly affirm that Jerusalem was chosen of the Father, and must be recognized as the World Headquarters by all of the remnant people holding to the New Testament name, and the true faith once delivered to the saints, as they are led further by the Holy Spirit as Jesus returns. —" Watch ye therefore and pray always that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass and to stand before the Son of man. — Luke 21:24 to 36.

- **3. The Ongoing Priesthood Question:** The priesthood was an "everlasting priesthood throughout their generations" (*Exodus 40:15*). What was the role of the remaining sons, Eleazar and Ithamar, in continuing the ministry, and what lessons can be applied to sustaining God's mission through generational leadership? Scripture: *Exodus 40:15*, *Numbers 3:4*, *Heb. 10:19-20*, *Heb. 7:23-27*
- **4. Preparing the Successor Question:** Moses was also a critical part of the Levitical leadership, but he had to pass the baton to Joshua (*Deuteronomy 31:2*). What are the key elements of Moses' preparation of Joshua, and how can older leaders use this model to train and mentor the next generation? Scripture: *Deuteronomy 31:7–8, 12, Jn. 17: 6-8, 2 Tim. 1:5-7, 2:1-2; Ps. 78:4-7,*
- **5. Letting go of control: Question:** Moses passed the leadership of Israel to Joshua. What was Moses' attitude as he transitioned leadership, knowing he would not see the promised land? What challenges can arise for leaders who struggle to release control to their successors? What do YahShua and Paul say about finishing the race? Scripture: *Deut.* 31:2-8; *Num.* 20: 23-28; 2 Tim. 4:7-8, *Jn* 17: 3-9
- **6. The Shift from Old to New Question:** The Levitical priesthood ultimately pointed to Jesus, the Great High Priest. How does the baton pass from the Aaronic priesthood to the new covenant in Christ, and how should this change our perspective on leadership and ministry today? Scripture: *Hebrews 4:14–16, Hebrews 7:11–14*
- **7.The cost of dropping the baton: Question:** The book of Judges opens with the consequences of a generation that failed to pass on the faith. What can we learn from this verse about the critical importance of being intentional in discipling the next generation? How can we ensure our children and spiritual children know the Lord and His works? Scripture: *Judges* 2:10-13, *Heb.* 3:12, 10:26-27, 2 Pet. 2:20-22
- **8. Passing the Baton in the Body of Christ. Teamwork and humility: Question:** Passing the baton is a team effort, not a competition. The Apostle Paul wrote, "What you have heard from me... entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also" (2 Timothy 2:2). How does this verse emphasize the need for teamwork and humility in spiritual mentor ship? How does this New Testament command reflect the principles of succession seen in the Old Testament priesthood, and who are you mentoring to receive and carry the "baton" of the gospel? How can we foster a culture where leaders desire their successors to be even "greater" than themselves? Scripture: 2 Timothy 2:2, Heb. 12:1-2; 1 Cor. 3:10-11;

Psalm 78:4-7

Subject: The Sacred Hand-off: Passing the Baton Scripture Reading: Deut. 8:1, & John 17 Memory Verse: Tit. 1:6 & 7

Central Theme: This lesson is about the biblical concept of "passing the baton" from one generation of leadership to the next, with a focus on the transfer of the Levitical priesthood and Paul's commandment to Timothy and Titus. This lesson explores the principles of preparation, mentorship, and trust in God's divine plan for succession.

Introductory Scriptures: "And take thou unto thee Aaron thy brother, and his sons with him, and from among the children of Israel, that he may minister unto me in the priest's office, even Aaron, Nadab, and Abihu, Eleazar, and Ithamar, Aaron's sons. (Exodus 28:1 KJV) "When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy grandmother Lois, and thy mother Eunice; and I am persuaded that in thee also. Wherefore I put thee in remembrance that thou stir up the gift of God, which is in thee by the putting on of my hands. For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind, (2 Tim. 1:5-7 KJV). For this cause left I thee in Crete, that thou shouldest set in order the things that are wanting, and ordain elders in every city, as I had appointed thee: If any be blameless, the husband of one wife, having faithful children not accused of riot and unruly. For A bishop must be blameless, as the steward of God; not self-willed, and not soon angry, not given to wine, no striker, not given to filthy lucre (Tit. 1:5-7 KJV)

MILESTONES OF GOD'S GRACE OUR HUMBLE BEGINNING: A SEED PLANTED



2000-2005: Pastor Nyakako (then Deacon Nyakako) and Sister Nyakako moved their family of 7 young children from Cincinnati, Ohio, to Princeton, MA. After visiting a few COG 7th Day congregations in larger Boston and not finding a home church holding the gospel truth as they were taught, Pastor's family resolved to drive 3 hours and back most Sabbaths to their home church in Spring Valley, New York, and when not in Spring Valley, they held Worship at their in Princeton

2005-2010: After much fasting and prayers, and great encouragement from the late Pastor Morrison, Deacon Nyakako and Sister Nyakako registered the Church in Worcester. The First Sabbath service was held at Main Street, Worcester, filled with prayer and praise. Sis Johnson joined the family in 2007, Sis. Njoroge joined the church family in 2008 Her Family later joined 2009, Pst. Waweru joined together with his family in 2011. We worshiped in the rental place, although we had to leave it by 6 PM every Sabbath, which presented MT. Zion with difficulties during fasting services and long summer hours. Deacon Nyakako was ordained as Pastor Nyakako by Bishop Bennet and Pastor D. Morrison. Membership continued to grow with some members who moved to Boston for university.

[2011-2015]: God heard our prayers for a better location that accorded us complete rental with our own control of the facility at Piedmont Street (just next door to our previous rental place on Main St.), a testament to God's mercies and prayers answered. Baptisms, Weddings. Pastor Waweru and family join our Congregation. Sis Njoroge's children migrate from Kenya and join the congregation. Our greatly beloved Pastor Morrison goes to sleep in 2014 until YahShua returns. His great evangelist work and growing the MT. Zion organization and legacy, warmth, love, and sheer joy still remain with us today. Pastor Nyakako led mission trips to Kenya and Israel and a relationship with COGMERS Kenya, as well as Yahweh and other Church Of God 7th Day ministries in Kenya began.

2016-2020: Baptism continues. Through Sis. Nyakako and Church's great efforts, We acquired our current building at 124-126 Dewey St., Worcester, through prayers, much sacrifice from the congregation. We remodeled the building into the beautiful Sanctuary that it is today. The Church was opened late that 2016.Arrival of new Kenyan and Jamaican Ministers to members of Worcester Assembly. Outreach and evangelism started in earnest with outside preaching, street corners, visitingthe shut-ins, and door-to-door ministry. COVID-19 spreads, but the church remains open forworship. Division within the church and the Jamaican Assembly. North East becomes its own entity.

2021-2025: Worship continues through COVID-19 and Zoom platform. We start outsideevangelism in the church parking lot and preach. Continued focus in evangelism through door-to-door ministry, street ministry, and nursing home ministry. Food pantry ministry continues, and the annual cookout at the church continues. The annual pre-Thanksgiving dinner started for the community. Bro. Morrison is ordained Evangelist Morrison. Young men's focused training for leadership and ministry began.

Summary of Andrew N. Dugger's Work

Dugger's work was defined by a commitment to what he believed were strictly biblical doctrines and church structure.

Promoting Sabbatarianism: Following in his father's footsteps, Dugger was a vigorous defender of the Saturday Sabbath and other doctrines like observing Passover on Nisan 14 and adhering to "clean meats" dietary laws.

Literary and Editorial Influence: As editor of **The Bible Advocate** for 18 years, he was a primary voice of the Church of God (Seventh Day). His books, particularly **The Bible Home Instructor** and **A History of the True Church**, became foundational texts that influenced many Sabbatarians, including Herbert W. Armstrong. Missionary Expansion: He traveled widely, held public debates, and through his efforts and the **Mt. Zion Reporter**, helped establish congregations across the Caribbean, Africa, and other international locations.

Jerusalem Headquarters: His most significant work was the conviction that the Church of God should have its world headquarters in Jerusalem, Israel, as a biblical requirement. This belief led to the 1933 schism and his permanent relocation to Jerusalem in 1953, where he led the Churches of God 7th Day of Mount Zion until his death.

- America as a Sanctuary: The interpretation of prophecy shows that America became a haven for these persecuted groups, including Sabbatarian Anabaptists and William Penn's followers, as the "earth helped the woman" (the true church) during the time of papal decline after 1798.
- Emphasis on Jerusalem: Dugger believed in a strong scriptural church organization with a world headquarters in Jerusalem, which he himself moved to later in life.
- Sole Rule of Faith: The emphasis is on the Bible as the sole authority, rejecting extra-biblical sources of doctrine like the visions of Ellen G. White (a key difference between their church and the Seventh-day Adventist Church).
- A History of the True Church, Andrew N. Dugger and Clarence O. Dodd presented a non-traditional account of Christian history, arguing that God's true church has always been a distinct, Sabbath-keeping remnant persecuted by the dominant Roman Catholic Church and its Protestant offshoots.

Andrew N. Dugger and Effie Dugger



(1886–1975) was an influential minister (Elder) in the Sabbatarian movement, known for his leadership in the Church of God (Seventh Day) and later for establishing a global headquarters in Jerusalem. His work centered on strict biblical adherence, including Saturday Sabbath observance, clean meats, and a specific form of church governance.

A HISTORY OF THE TRUE CHURCH

In 1936, A.N. Dugger (who spread the good news to many that believed and who started the work of MT. Zion Church of God 7th Day) and C.O. Dodd presented a historical timeline that we MT. Zion Church Of God 7th Day believes in that aimed to trace the continuous existence of a "true" Christian church, specifically identified as a Sabbath-keeping body (the Church of God, Seventh Day), from the apostolic era to the 20th century.

SUMMARY

The central argument of the book called "A History of the True Church" is that the true Christian faith, established by Jesus and the Apostles, was not extinguished by the rise of the Roman Catholic Church and subsequent "apostasy." Instead, this "true church," characterized by practices such as observing the seventh-day Sabbath and adhering to a scriptural form of church organization, persisted in various forms, often in obscurity or through persecution, referred to as being "driven into the wilderness" (Revelation 12). Dugger and Todd presented these Key themes and arguments:

- The "True" vs. "False" Church: The book contrasts the "woman clothed with the sun" (the true church) with the "woman clothed in scarlet" (the Roman Catholic Church and its "sun-worship" doctrines).
- Sabbath Observance: A primary marker of the "true church" throughout history is its adherence to the seventh-day Sabbath, as opposed to Sunday worship, which the authors argue was introduced by the Roman Church.
- Prophecy and History: Dugger and Todd interpreted historical events correctly through a prophetic lens, applying biblical prophecies (especially from Daniel and Revelation) to the history of the church and the Papacy. The rise of the Papacy is linked to a 1260-year period of persecution, beginning around 538 A.D. to 1798 A.D.
- Succession of Believers (Remnants): Dugger and Dodd trace Sabbath Keeping spiritual lineage through various historical groups, including the Paulicians, the Celtic Church, the Vaudois (Waldenses) in the Alps, the Hussites, and later, Sabbatarian Baptists in England and the Adventist movement in the United States.
- Rejection of Roman Doctrines: Dugger and Todd highlight the "true church's" opposition to doctrines and practices introduced by Rome, such as Easter, infant baptism, the use of images, and the concept of the immortality of the soul.
- The Great Apostasy: Dugger and Todd contended that a great apostasy, centered in Rome, began shortly after the death of the apostles, introducing false doctrines like Sunday worship, Easter, and the immortality of the soul, largely influenced by pagan "Sunworshippers". They identify the Papacy as the "little horn" that made war with the saints of God for a prophetic period of 1,260 years (from AD 538 to 1798), driving the true church "into the wilderness" (into hiding in remote areas like the Alps).

8. The cost of dropping the baton:

Question: The book of Judges opens with the consequences of a generation that failed to pass on the faith. What can we learn from this verse about the critical importance of being intentional in discipling the next generation? How can we ensure our children and spiritual children know the Lord and His works?

Scripture: Judges 2:10-13, Heb. 3:12, 10:26-27, 2 Pet. 2:20-22

Judges 2:10-13 ¹⁰ And also all that generation were gathered unto their fathers: and there arose another generation after them, which knew not the Lord, nor yet the works which he had done for Israel. ¹¹ And the children of Israel did evil in the sight of the Lord, and served Baalim: ¹² And they forsook the Lord God of their fathers, which brought them out of the land of Egypt, and followed other gods, of the gods of the people that were round about them, and bowed themselves unto them, and provoked the Lord to anger. ¹³ And they forsook the Lord, and served Baal and Ashtaroth.

<u>Hebrews 3:12</u> ¹² Take heed, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief, in departing from the living God.

2. The Importance of Public Consecration

Question: The consecration of Aaron and his sons was a public, ceremonial event. What was the significance of this public display for the congregation of Israel, and what modern applications can be drawn for publicly affirming new leaders in the church? Scripture: Leviticus 8:1–9, 22-24, 30; Acts 6:1-6, 13:1-3; 1Tim. 4:14 8 And the Lord spake unto Moses, saying,

4. The Ongoing Priesthood

Question: The priesthood was an "everlasting priesthood throughout their generations" (Exodus 40:15). What was the role of the remaining sons, Eleazar and Ithamar, in continuing the ministry, and what lessons can be applied to sustaining God's mission through generational leadership? MScripture: Exodus 40:15, Numbers 3:4, Heb. 10:19-20, Heb. 7:23-27

Exodus 40:15 ¹⁵ And thou shalt anoint them, as thou didst anoint their father, that they may minister unto me in the priest's office: for their anointing shall surely be an everlasting priesthood throughout their generations.

Numbers 3:4 And Nadab and Abihu died before the Lord, when they offered strange fire before the Lord, in the wilderness of Sinai, and they had no children: and Eleazar and Ithamar ministered in the priest's office in the sight of Aaron their father.

Hebrews 10:19-20 ¹⁹ Having therefore, brethren, boldness to enter into the holiest by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰ By a new and living way, which he hath consecrated for us, through the veil, that is to say, his flesh;

Hebrews 7:23-27²³ And they truly were many priests, because they were not suffered to continue by reason of death: ²⁴ But this man, because he continueth ever, hath an unchangeable priesthood. ²⁵ Wherefore he is able also to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by him, seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for them. ²⁶ For such an high priest became us, who is holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and made higher than the heavens; ²⁷ Who needeth not daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifice, first for his own sins, and then for the people's: for this he did once, when he offered up himself.


5. Preparing the Successor

Question: Moses was also a critical part of the Levitical leadership, but he had to pass the baton to Joshua (Deuteronomy 31:2). What are the key elements of Moses' preparation of Joshua, and how can older leaders use this model to train and mentor the next generation? Scripture: Deuteronomy 31:7–8, 12, Jn. 17: 6-8, 2 Tim. 1:5-7, 2:1-2; Ps. 78:4-7,

Deuteronomy 31:7-8⁷ And Moses called unto Joshua, and said unto him in the sight of all Israel, Be strong and of a good courage: for thou must go with this people unto the land which the Lord hath sworn unto their fathers to give them; and thou shalt cause them to inherit it. ⁸ And the Lord, he it is that doth go before thee; he will be with thee, he will not fail thee, neither forsake thee: fear not, neither be dismayed. ¹² Gather the people together, men and women, and children, and thy stranger that is within thy gates, that they may hear, and that they may learn, and fear the Lord your God, and observe to do all the words of this law:

John 17:6-8° I have manifested thy name unto the men which thou gavest me out of the world: thine they were, and thou gavest them me; and they have kept thy word. Now they have known that all things whatsoever thou hast given me are of thee. For I have given unto them the words which thou gavest me; and they have received them, and have known surely that I came out from thee, and they have believed that thou didst send me.

<u>2 Timothy 1:5-7</u> When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy grandmother Lois, and thy mother Eunice; and I am

9. Passing the Baton in the Body of Christ. Teamwork and humility: Question: Passing the baton is a team effort, not a competition. The Apostle Paul wrote, "What you have heard from me... entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also" (2 Timothy 2:2). How does this verse emphasize the need for teamwork and humility in spiritual mentorship? How does this New Testament command reflect the principles of succession seen in the Old Testament priesthood, and who are you mentoring to receive and carry the "baton" of the gospel? How can we foster a culture where leaders desire their successors to be even "greater" than themselves? Scripture: 2 Timothy 2:2, Heb. 12:1-2; 1 Cor. 3:10-11; Psalm 78:4-7

2 Timothy 2:2 And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also. Hebrews 12:1-2 12 Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, 2 Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.
